For your top priorities, provide at least two actionable steps you'd take to address each issue.

Tips

Make your manifesto eye-catching and interesting while also conveying what you stand for and why you think it is important.

Avoid unfeasible ideas as they will only set you up for failure. To avoid this stay updated with what the SU planning to ensure you address what is important.
